The Association of Jewish Refugees (AJR) provides an extensive range of social and welfare services, and grants financial assistance to Jewish victims of Nazi persecution living in Great Britain.

Membership is extended to all Jewish victims of Nazi persecution, their spouses, children and grandchildren and the AJR counts as its members former refugees from all Nazi-occupied countries.

Social services

The AJR's team of dedicated social care workers attend to the day-to-day needs of those of our members requiring support, guidance and clarification on a wide range of social, welfare and care needs.

Continental Friends

The Southend and Westcliff Hebrew Congregation host gatherings of our Essex group, one of 38 regular national gatherings of AJR members. These social occasions offer our members a unique opportunity to socialise, share their experiences and enjoy entertainment. It is at such gatherings that many old friends have been re-united after more than 50 years.

Kindertransport

A special interest group of the AJR, the Kindertransport represent the children who fled Nazi-controlled Germany, Austria and Czechoslovakia between 1938 and 1939 and prior to the start of the Second World War.

Journal

All AJR members receive the monthly *AJR Journal*, which combines news analysis with feature articles as well as book, theatre and film reviews. The *Journal* also contains profiles of personalities with a connection to the refugee community and promotes forthcoming AJR events and activities.

Central Office for Holocaust Claims (UK)

The Claims Office provides advice and assistance to Nazi victims and their heirs on a wide range of Holocaust era asset restitution and compensation for persecution, including dormant bank accounts and unpaid insurance policies.
