MEZUZUT AT YOUR DOORPOSTS *Thoughts on the Parsha*

This week's Parasha relates how Korach, from the tribe of Levi, challenged and rebelled against the leadership of Moshe. Korach confronted Moshe with several questions, one of them concerning a Mezuzah. According to the Torah every house should have a Mezuzah on its right doorposts, which is a small scroll of parchment containing the first two paragraphs of the *Shema*. Korach asked Moshe the following question: "Does a house filled with scrolls of the Torah require a Mezuzah?" Moshe replied: "Yes, a Mezuzah is required on every doorpost of every Jewish home" and that the contents of the house did not change that requirement. Korach did not accept Moshe's answer and mocked it.

But in truth, why in fact should a house full of Torah scrolls or books of the entire Torah require a Mezuzah? After all, a Mezuzah contains only two portions of the Torah! Also, what if one has a Mezuzah in a beautiful case, lying on his shelf; why is this not good enough? What is the deeper significance of having a Mezuzah nailed to the doorposts?

Perhaps the answer is that although the bookshelves of a house may be filled with Torah scrolls or other holy books, this may not necessarily ensure that its inhabitants will behave according to the Torah. It is the Mezuzah on the doorposts, which symbolizes Hashem's presence in the home. The Mezuzah is placed on the doorposts, where one enters his/her room or home and leaves it. It is as if he/she takes Hashem's teachings with them wherever they go. Our Torah is not reserved to a bookshelf or a place of study alone for an intellectual exercise. It is a factor in our lives at all times, and all our actions are guided by the Torah.

Someone visited his Rabbi and boasted about all the Torah he had learned and mastered. The Rabbi replied, "You only tell me about the Torah that you have learned, but what has the Torah taught you?"

Let us not ask, 'How much do we know about Torah and Judaism??' But rather let us ask, 'How much has Torah taught, educated and refined us?'"
