GIVING IS GETTING *Thoughts on the Parsha*

This week's Parasha alludes to the Jewish idea of giving minimally 10% of one's net income to charity. A charity collector once visited a wealthy man in the hopes of receiving a donation. The wealthy fellow politely explained how he would love to give but can't, because he already gave his share of charity for the year. As evidence, he pointed to a pile of receipts on his desk. The collector looked around the room, noticing his beautiful surroundings in the wealthy man's home. Respectfully, he asked his host whether he could share a Torah insight. The wealthy man agreed.

During the time of our Holy Temple in Jerusalem, the collector began, a Jewish livestock owner was obligated to tithe his flock. How was this done? He would pen the cattle in an enclosure and open up the door. As each animal exited the enclosure he would count: one, two, three, etc. When he counted the tenth, he would mark the animal with red dye. That animal would then be set aside to be brought to Jerusalem.

But why make the farmer endure this whole process of penning the animals and then driving them out the exit? Why not just take ten percent off the top? The answer, concludes the collector, gives us a profound insight into the Mitzvah of giving.

As each animal goes out the door, concludes the collector, it is as if Hashem is telling the person, 'One is for you, two is for you, three is for you...' After giving the owner nine, Hashem then asks for only one. After keeping nine, the farmer realizes how all of his wealth comes from Hashem and that though he is giving, he is getting much more. The point hit home. The wealthy man recognized his many blessings and happily gave a generous donation.

In Jewish thinking, Hashem gives us money so we'll use it to make His world a better place. Yes, we should enjoy it also, and that's why one shouldn't give away more than 20%. But the true pleasure of money is the opportunity to use it to help others. Even the best investment you can find will pay you nothing, once you have moved on from this world, as we all do one fine day. Only that which you invest in charitable giving can truly last forever.
