JOURNEYS OF PROGRESS Thoughts on the Parsha

"These are the journeys of the children of Israel who went out of the land of Egypt". On this, follows the succession of wanderings by the children of Israel during their forty years' in the wilderness. The names of their camping-places in full and, at first glance, perhaps excessive detail.

This point is raised by Rashi who sees this detailed listing of the places of wandering as a manifesto of Hashem's kindness. In thirty-eight years the Jewish people made only twenty journeys. The purpose of this traveling was to rehabilitate the people, morally and spiritually, to prepare them to enter the Holy Land in purity and strength. And it is in grateful recognition of this spiritual recovery that each stage of the journey is so lovingly named.

Rashi quotes an analogy of a King who took his sick son on a journey to recover from his illness. After he had been cured, and as they were returning home, the father pointed out every stopping-place on their journey. For him, these places signified stages in his son's journey to health, and were invested with an aura of gratitude and love.

And on a deeper level, the significance of mentioning each and every stopping place, reaches even further than this historical insight. Spiritual achievement and material achievement differ not only in their goals, but in their processes. In material affairs it is the end-product that is one's concern.

In the spiritual spirit realms, however, completion, realisation is no 'sine qua non'. Here, each motion, each effort is imbued with significance and value. Not only the final achievement, but also the process of achievement, is the object of the spiritual life. In the Ethics of the Fathers we say: 'Lefum Tzara Agra' — the reward and value are proportionate to the effort involved. And the Talmud says: "If someone tells you he has striven, but has not found, do not believe him".

The long and weary progress of the Children of Israel through the wilderness is a model of this truth. And the separate mention of each of their journeys illustrates the essential importance of each individual stage of the journey towards holiness.
