CONCERN FOR THE PROPERTY OF ANOTHER - RETURNING LOST ARTICLES

To protect someone else from financial loss is not only commendable, but one who can do so is specifically forbidden to ignore the opportunity. The Torah illustrates this with regard to the return of lost animals and to helping fallen beasts of burden, but by extension it applies to every case where one's physical or verbal intervention can help someone avoid a loss.

Ramban explains that the first time this commandment was given (*Shemot 23:4*), it spoke of an animal wandering off the path, which could be returned easily. Here, it adds the case of an animal that was cast off, meaning that it had runaway, and would require exertion to bring it in - and investigation to locate its owner.

You must not look on when your fellowman's ox or his lamb runs away 'and hide yourself' and neglect your attention of them; you must make every effort to bring them back to your fellowman.

The term '*Vehitalamta*' — *and hide yourself* could be taken to mean that one should ignore the lost animal. The Sages expound that if someone is an elder or other distinguished person who would not even retrieve his own animal in similar circumstances because it would be degrading for him, he is permitted to ignore someone else's animal as well. But he must do for someone else whatever he would do for himself in a similar situation. (*Rashi*).

Homiletically, this phrase could be interpreted as the reason it is necessary for the Torah even to mention the commandment to return a lost item, for logically one should think: "*How could I even think of keeping something that does not belong to me, and how could I even think of ignoring my fellow Jew's lost object when he is anguished at its loss?*"

In truth, however, this must be made an explicit commandment, because human greed and laziness are such that many people will seize the opportunity to claim a lost article for themselves or to avoid the tedious task of trying to find the owner. It is as if the Torah says: "*You must be commanded to return it, because you will be tempted to hide yourself to avoid the trouble.*"
