APPRECIATING HASHEM'S BLESSING Thoughts on this week's parasha

"And you will rejoice with all the good which Hashem your G-d gave to you and to your household, you and the Levi and the convert who are among you" (Devarim 26:11).

Later in the parasha, when the Torah lists the curses, it says: "Because you did not serve Hashem your G-d with joy and with a glad heart, when you had everything in abundance" (28:47). We learn from these verses that serving Hashem without joy is in itself a serious transgression which could lead to all the curses enumerated in this parasha. (Maimonides. Hilchot Lulay 8:15).

As we see, Hashem explicitly commands us to serve Him with joy. Let us try to understand the meaning of this commandment. The words; "And you will rejoice with all the good which Hashem your G-d gave you" relate to the Torah's commandment to bring the First Fruits (Bikkurim) to Jerusalem. The first ripe fruits of seven specific varieties were brought to the Temple in Jerusalem and given to the Kohanim.

By bringing the First Fruits from our fields to the Kohanim serving in the Temple, and by separating tithes, we publicly proclaim our awareness that it was not "my might and the strength of my hand [which] made me all this wealth." We recognize that Hashem alone is "the One Who gives you the strength to prosper" (Devarim 8:17-18), and that it is "Hashem's blessing which enriches" (Mishle 10:22). When we demonstrate our gratitude for Hashem's kindness by giving First Fruits and the tithes, our joy will be complete, and we will merit wholehearted enjoyment of Hashem's blessings and bounty.

Our Talmudic Sages describe this phenomenon as "melach mammon chasser" - money is salted by decreasing it (Ketubot 66b). Rashi explains that one who wishes to "salt" his money in order to preserve it should constantly trim it down through charity. Charity acts on wealth as salt acts on meat. There is "wealth which is preserved for its owner to his detriment" (Kohelet 5:12).

Charity is the safest, most effective preservative of all, ensuring that our money will stay with us, not to our detriment, but to our benefit.
