## THE WAGONS AND THE HEIFER Thoughts on this week's Parasha

Yaakov was mourning was 22 years for the loss of Yosef, who was slated to become the heir to the Abrahamic family. He was spending these years, trying to suppress the anger towards his sons whom he suspect of foul play against Yosef. Yaakov lost confidence in his sons, there is no apparent hair anymore, the family is dissolving.

Then an amazing incident happened. The family goes to the Grand Vizier of Egypt for food. After a number of troubles Yehuda makes a passionate plea and tells Yosef how life's difficulties have affected Yaakov and describes to him his constant state of mourning. The Grand Vizier reveals himself as Yosef and tells them that he wants to see Yaakov. When Yaakov sees the wagons Yosef sent to bring him to Egypt, Yaakov's spirits are revived.

What is so special about the "agalot" - wagons - to revive Yaakov's spirits? Rashi quotes a Midrash which explains that it was a code. The Hebrew word for a heifer is "egla", almost the same word as "agalot". Yosef was sending a sign to Yaakov: "Remember the last thing we studied together before you sent me to find out about the welfare of my brothers? It was about the broken necked heifer!"

As we know, the "egla arufa" - broken necked heifer happens as a result of an unresolved murder mystery. The elders of the towns say: we are not directly guilty of this crime but it may was someone who was insane or hungry carried out the killing, perhaps we should have been more careful in looking after the needs of that person. They bring the heifer as a sacrifice for an unintentional misdeed.

Yaakov is the elder of the family. He cannot completely blame his sons for their misdeed as he himself engendered the jealousy by being to affectionate towards Yosef he was unintentionally guilty of the crime. When Yaakov sees the "agalot" - wagons and the code sign that reminded him about the law of the broken necked heifer he and Yosef studied together he understands that Yosef has forgiven Yaakov for the tragedy that befell him.

The repentance of Yaakov and Yosef's forgiving of the root cause of his tragic circumstances begin by Yaakov seeing the wagons sent by his beloved son, Yosef. This is the first step towards the reunification of all other members of the family, Yosef forgiving his brothers and bringing them all to Egypt to be near him and establish Jewish life there.
